The lounge is complete with a two-seater sofa bed, perfect for relaxing or accommodating guests, and a thoughtfully designed corner unit equipped with a stereo for entertainment.

In the galley, functionality meets style with an L-shaped kitchen, featuring undercounter cupboards and eyeline cupboards for ample storage. The space is further enhanced by a granite-topped unit, giving a touch of elegance to the space. 
