Built with precision and care, Luna Bug's hull by Paul Widdowson and fit-out by Kingfisher ensures a reliable and enduring vessel. The hull, with a robust thickness of 10/6/4, underwent its last blacking in 2021, utilizing bitumen and accompanied by a comprehensive hull survey.

Powering Luna Bug is a reliable Beta Marine engine coupled with a Newage gearbox, showcasing 1738 engine hours and a last service in 2022. This 2+2 berth boat is equipped with a cassette toilet, providing comfort and convenience during your waterway adventures.

Inside, Luna Bug offers a generous cabin height of 6'6" and is insulated with Rockwool, ensuring a comfortable living space. The galley features a gas cooker, fridge, microwave, and kettle, complemented by a comprehensive set of crockery, pots, and pans. The lounge is adorned with a multifuel stove, a mounted TV, a sofa bed, and ample shelving and cupboards.

The bathroom is designed for relaxation, offering a shower over the bath and a Thetford Cassette toilet. The master bedroom is a haven of comfort, featuring a double bed with cabinets above, a wardrobe, and two tall storage units.

Luna Bug is well-equipped for extended journeys, with a 450-litre water tank capacity and a 135-litre fuel tank. The boat is powered by both 12v and 240v electric supply, supported by a galvanic isolator. Heating options include a multifuel stove and a Webasto central heating system.

Additional features include a roof box for extra storage, external covers for the stern deck and cratch, and side hatches in the mid galley for added ventilation. Luna Bug comes with two 13kg gas cylinders.

Currently moored at the scenic Caen Hill Marina in Wiltshire, Luna Bug offers the option of a mooring. This delightful boat is the perfect size for exploring waterways or creating a cosy home or weekend retreat.
