Cooking aboard is a pleasure, thanks to the Vanette four-burner gas hob, Thetford duplex oven and grill, and Paloma gas hot water heater, ensuring a warm meal is never far away. A fridge with a freezer compartment keeps perishables fresh, while the sink and drainer make cleanup effortless. Soft carpeting underfoot adds a touch of warmth, making the galley as inviting as it is functional.

Moving into the lounge, a cosy atmosphere welcomes you. Two comfortable leather chairs provide the perfect spot to unwind, surrounded by wooden shelving and a corner cupboard for books and keepsakes.
